Spectrum is an auditioned, performance-based group designed to instruct the students in intermediate and advanced techniques of treble voice singing and listening, as well as skills in arranging, vocal percussion, leadership, and more. Please read the following information carefully, as it will be necessary to your personal success and the success of the ensemble.

Student Responsibilities

- Bring to each rehearsal: your sheet music, a refillable bottle of water, a pencil, and a good attitude.
- If you are absent from rehearsal, it is your responsibility to find out what you missed.
 You may ask another member of the group, or Mr. Grossman
- All music will be performed from memory.
- Courtesy and respect will be practiced towards other students and Mr. Grossman at all times.

Attendance Policy

- All members are expected to be on time for each rehearsal for the full rehearsal.
- No absences are 'excused.' Attendance will be taken at each rehearsal, and members whose attendance drops below 85% may lose out on solo or performance opportunities until attendance rises above the 85% mark. Attendance below 70% will be grounds for removal from the ensemble.
- If you play a sport or are involved with other activities in or out of school that may cause conflicts (including jobs), meet with Mr. Grossman once the schedule is released so that any conflicts that will arise can be dealt with early on.
- Do NOT come to Mr. Grossman the week of a rehearsal or performance with a conflict that could have been avoided with better planning and/or time management, i.e., appointments, work schedules, etc. School work absolutely comes first, but time management is an important skill, and projects, papers or studying held until the last minute are not grounds for missing rehearsal.
- In regards to sports, games take priority over rehearsals, and performances should take priority over practices. If a practice and rehearsal conflict, overlapping time should be split between the two. Games and performances conflicting can be worked out in a case-by-case basis. **Students that are balancing ensembles and sports are expected to discuss this policy with their sport's coach before the season begins to avoid any mid-season conflicts.**
- When a performance opportunity is presented to the group, if you state that you can be there, then your attendance is mandatory.

A group is only as successful as its members are willing to work hard. 15 people, all working hard with commitment, is the first, and most necessary step of creating an absolutely amazing, fun and rewarding experience. Work for those other 14 members.

Academic Eligibility:

As stated in the Plymouth Public Schools Handbook for Students and Families:

"In order to participate in any extracurricular activity, a student must not receive more than one "F" on their report card.

Academic eligibility of all students shall be considered as official and determined only on the date when the report card has been issued to the parents of all students."
